



Realizing IFRM's mission statement "...to promote music through school and community projects," the Fellowship moved ahead in 2007 to fund three projects.

Our inaugural project is the re-establishment of the music program at St. Andrew's RC School in Grenada. Wind and flood from two consecutive hurricanes in 2004 destroyed all musical instruments at the school. IFRM was contacted by United Kingdom IFRM member **Peter Sotheran** (RC of Guisborough and Great Ayton) about the school's needs. The Fellowship responded with a grant to purchase needed instruments and music books (see Peter Sotheran's article, *Grenada*).

We all know the effects of Hurricane Katrina on New Orleans, LA, USA. One of the hardest hit schools was McDonogh 15 School for the Creative Arts. Serving over 400 kindergartens through eighth grade students, this arts magnet school was devastated by the effects of the hurricane. IFRM Treasurer **Curtis Reinhardt** worked with Mr. Holland's Opus Foundation to see how the Fellowship could contribute. The end result was an IFRM grant that purchased six trumpets for the school's band. This grant, combined with the Opus' grant, re-established McDonogh's music program.

Lastly, joining Rotary Club Manila 101 in the Philippines, IFRM is contributing monies to fund age-appropriate music books, CDs, and DVDs for a mobile media center in two Greater Manila barangays for pre-school children.

Through these linkages, IFRM is actualizing its mission statement!

Grenada By Peter Sotheran, MBE

In 2004, Hurricanes Ivan and Emily damaged or destroyed over 90% of the buildings on the equatorial spice island of Grenada. One of the hardest hit buildings was St. Andrew's RC School. In addition to ripping off the school's roof, high winds and flooding destroyed the school's library and damaged its musical instruments.

The Rotary Clubs of Guisborough & Great Ayton and Kenilworth, combined with a simplified grant from UK District 1030, raised enough monies to reestablish the library at St. Andrew's School. Through this initial involvement with the school, we discovered the critical needs of the school's music department.

As an IFRM member, I contacted the IFRM to see if they could help. Concurrently, I put out a call for donations of recorders through the local newspaper. The response was overwhelming. Thirty-eight recorders were donated, and IFRM granted monies to help re-establish St. Andrew's music program.

Representing IFRM, I joined with the Rotary Club of Grenada East in presenting IFRM's check to Sister Lucy, Principal of St. Andrew's. Her thanks were heartfelt, "We are very touched by your thoughtfulness and generous contribution....We look forward to the day when we can play proudly as a school and bring joy and cheer to those who listen."

Patrick Dheur, concert pianist, composer and pastpresident of the Rotary Club of Liege Nord-Est, Belgium, played a recital in Evanston, Illinois on September 30, 2006. His program was sponsored by the Wilmette Rotary Club and supported by the Rotary Club of Evanston and the Evanston Lighthouse Rotary Club (all District 6440). Funds raised by the recital will be used to purchase a machine to measure the presence of the AIDS virus in a clinic in Kitwe, Zambia.

Dheur's performance in Nichols Hall of the Music Institute of Chicago (Evanston, IL) included compositions by Mozart, Schumann, Chopin and Liszt as well as his own composition, "Hymn of Rotary" from his "Rotarian Symphony.

Patrick Dheur trained in Belgium at the Royal Conservatoire of Liege, his native city where he resides with is wife and two young daughters. He has performed in Denmark, Switzerland, Scotland, Russia, Egypt, Japan, Spain, Italy, Israel, France, Venezuela and other countries.

During the intermission, Princess Kasune Zulu of Zambia, AIDS advocate and educator, spoke about the plight of AIDS sufferers in her country. "Many people are starting to change their behaviors. They can say, yes, I may be infected, but somebody cares, even though miles away." Our Rotarian Music Fellowship members care!

Planning for this recital began during the 2005 Convention in Chicago when **Dr. John Hillebrand**, pianist and past-president, Wilmette Rotary Club, hosted Patrick Dheur. "Our friendship and this collaborative effort developed throughout the year and culminated with the September 30 performance," says Hillebrand. During three days prior to the performance, Dheur attended a meeting of the

Wilmette Rotary Club and also the Rotary Club of Evanston, where he played his "Hymn of Rotary" to the delight of club members.

RI President Bill Boyd Speaks

IFRM Chair Susan DuPree and Secretary Lee Denlinger joined over 900 Rotarians in welcoming **Rotary International President Bill Boyd** at a dinner in his honor January 3, 2007 in Santa Clara, California USA.

Perched on a stool center stage, RI President Bill stated, "It's very easy for us to decide what other people need." Rotarians often see and fund projects that they perceive as critical needs. The real needs, however, may be quite different and a lot more basic. President Bill went on to explain that we often see projects through the eyes of a technologically advanced country which limits our ability to perceive the basic needs that underlie developing communities. For example, while we think in terms of changing agricultural systems or providing seed and implements, the villagers think in terms of erecting structures that will keep them dry during the rainy season or finding enough firewood to cook their meals.

"It is important to ask, and then listen, to what people need. Our response should be to their needs...not to ours."

President Bill lauded the giving spirit that enkindles a Rotarian. "We can, and are, leading the way!"

Sweeping Changes Approved

Meeting in Pleasanton, California USA on March 3, 2007, the IFRM Directors approved sweeping changes *to bring the Fellowship into the 21st century*. Chief among these changes is the way IFRM will be doing business in the future.

Web Architect, François Daoust, created an on-line *IFRM Directory of Members* that is linked to PayPal. Beginning April 1, 2007, members can go to the website at <u>www.IFRM.org</u> to view and update their information. Each member will be given his own password in order to access the on-line services, which include paying/renewing dues, ordering IFRM publications, pins, and CDs. Check it out!

IFRM will be the **first** fellowship to have its own fellowship flag! You will be able to view it and order it on-line and at the IFRM Booth in Salt Lake City!

IFRM Foundation

In order to continue funding projects, the Directors are recommending for membership approval at the General Membership Meeting in June the formation of an *IFRM Foundation* with 501(c)3 status. Once approved, members will be able to give taxdeductible contributions to IFRM as well as raise monies through donations for tickets to IFRMsponsored concerts and events. Currently, IFRM has 501(c)7 non-profit status, but donations are not taxdeductible. **Chair Susan DuPree** states that forming a foundation opens the world to us by providing a vehicle to bring in donations for worldwide projects that promote *service above self through music*.

Membership Classifications Changed

The Directors approved a change in the membership classifications. They have dropped Group Memberships and changed the classification of Lifetime Members to Benefactors who will have lifetime benefits. The board also discussed raising the annual dues to \$15.00/year after the June RI Convention.
