Na Mele a me Na Leo O Hana (The Songs and the Voices of Hana) is an exciting indigenous music literacy program in Hana, Hawaii USA.

Traditionally, practitioners and *Kupuna* (elders) learn and share their *Oli* (chants) through memorization, listening, and modeling. These unwritten stories of great poetic quality are learned without formal instruction or musical notation.

With support from IFRM, Hana Maui Trust, and the Wailuku RC, Hana children and adults will learn, reaffirm, and perpetuate the knowledge and historical significance of the *Oli. Kupuna*, practitioners and teacher/mentors will teach Hana participants how to select, translate, and write in musical notation the traditional Hawaiian chants.

This indigenous music literacy project will be documented by videotaping of instruction and performance, thus preserving the indigenous Hawaiian musical traditions.

I'll keep you posted as our latest international project to further music education and provide an important and tangible cultural legacy continues to unfold.

"Make Dreams Real" is 2008-2009 RI President-elect Dong Kurn Lee's theme. It is also the title of the new song by IFRM Director, Chungsam Doh.

"I feel strongly that this song is simple enough to be translated into other languages," says Chungsam. Having already translated the song into Korean, Chungsam hopes that other Rotarians throughout the world will translate it into their language.

The very short song moves in a peppy 6/8 march-like tempo, which suggests the percussive rhythm of Korean farmer folk dances.

The major theme, Rotarians dream big and make dreams real, is repeated several times. The secondary theme is that Rotarians promote health and education for everyone and fight hunger and poverty. Chungsam wrote the song in the spirit expressed by President-elect Lee to the incoming District Governors at the 2008 International Assembly this past January. His challenge for Rotarians is to use our resources efficiently to maximize the good done around the world.

IFRM members will be demonstrating "Make Dreams Real" at the IFRM booth in LA this June. Song sheets and sheet music with piano accompaniment will be available there. Be sure to stop by to sing the song with your IFRM friends!

Take the new song back to your clubs and help members learn to sing it. With many Rotarians all around the world keeping the beat by singing, we will all dream big and help *Make Dreams Real*.

## Spotlight on...

Peter Moreton, Vice-Chair, IFRM, UK (RC of Northhampton) began collecting jazz and big band records in his schooldays. This led to him starting the Wellingborough Jazz club. As the record collection grew, so did his involvement in the world of music and entertainment. The record collection is impressive, covering around 100 years of recorded music, rare and unusual themes, original pressings, historical events and a good deal of humor.

Peter has seen and promoted most of the great Big Bands and jazz stars from both sides of the Atlantic and has interviewed and worked with many of them. For instance, he saw Glenn Miller in 1944 and is proud to still know his nephew, John. Peter was associated for long periods with the late, great Eddie Curtis Radio Big Band.

For over 40 years, Peter presented *A Musical Entertainment with a Difference*, a hour of nostalgia, humor, impersonations, and audience participation; and did a show for BBC Radio Northampton.. In addition, he produced *It Ought to Be Band*, from which comes his familiar moniker, *Dr. Swing*.

Among the many community and charity projects he has been involved in, Peter has been a very active member of Rotary: IFRM Vice-Chair since 2000; Northampton Club President (81-82), District 1070 Governor (91-92), Chairman of the Rotary in Great Britain Public Relations Committee (92-94), District Polio Plus Appeal Coordinator. Peter has also authored articles in *Rotary Today*, the RIBI magazine and the RIBI logo, "Humanity in Motion".


