Introducing Alisan Hastey

We welcome the newest member of the IFRM family and the new Rotary World Choir (RWC) Director, **Alisan Hastey.** Joining IFRM this past June in Houston, Alisan was already familiar with IFRM through her daughter, **Beth**, who sang with the RWC at the RI Convention in Atlanta, GA, and at the IFRM booth with our favorite Australian keyboard virtuoso, **Darrell Gaukroger.**

Alisan comes to us from Marysville, California, USA via Dallas, Texas, where she was raised by two musical parents: her Dad, a high school music teacher and former WW II US Army Band member and her Mother, a pianist and singer. In fact, she and her three older sisters were all expected to carry on the family choral and instrumental tradition, which is just what they did! Throughout her school years, Alisan studied piano, violin and French Horn, among other instruments and to wit she can claim mastery. Her pursuit of music continued into higher education, culminating in a Batchelor of Arts degree, dual-majors in Music Education and Psychology (Seattle Pacific University, [WA, USA), and a Master of Arts degree in Conducting (American Band College - Sam Houston State University, TX USA).

Prior to her retirement in 2019, Alisan built an impressive career as a music educator to students of all ages in choral, orchestral and band repertoires: Choral Director for Marysville High School (34 years); Vocal Technique and Piano instructor at Marysville Charter Academy for the Arts and Choral Director for the Yuba City Methodist Church (5 years). During the Covid-pandemic (2020-), she proudly taught piano at home to her young grandkids and just this past summer, served as Choir Director at her church summer camp. This fall, Alisan can be found teaching music at Yuba Community College while concurrently leading the Yuba Community College Symphony Band in her seventh year. Remarkably, she still finds time in her schedule to play in the local Symphony, serve on their Board of Directors, and make it to the local school board meeting, of which she is an active Director.

Supporting her in these myriad musical endeavors is **Brent Hastey**, Alisan's husband since 1982, a tenor who lends his voice to the local MESSIAH concert each Christmas holiday. Only four years later, Brent joined the South Yuba Rotary, followed in succession by older son, **Jared** and younger daughter, **Beth**. In 2021, Mom Alisan joined the Marysville Rotary Club, historically known for funding music projects and forming their own band. With her background, she is excited to contribute as Club Co-Chair for Community Service. [It's *notable* that there are four Hasteys from the same Marysville, California family active in Rotary - in two clubs-at the same time!]

Alison Hastey has expressed her initial goals as she begins her tenure as World Choir Director: to continue the musical legacy of the RWC set by her predecessor, **Judy Walker** (RC, Evanston, Ill); to reunite choir members by rekindling and the growing the relationships that form the basis of the IFRM family; to reference new resources, such as "Saturday Sings" and the New Songbook Database; and to expand opporunities to include band and orchestral music. Ironically, this could echo a return to our roots, as our fellowship was founded by a group of Rotarians who were avid band members.

Alisan says that RWC can look forward to doing what we do best: *making music* in that special space we create when we sing together and then *sharing the unique spirit* we create with our audience. Under Conductor Hastey's baton and with her energy, guidance and inspiration, we look forward to a successful RWC presence in Melbourne 2023!

Website News (www.IFRM.org)

Reigistration for the Rotary World Choir is now open on our website: www.ifrm.org Look at the top of the home page and click on "Rotary World Choir Registration." Complete the brief form, make your payment of \$25. Once you are registered you will begin to receive through e-mail specific information about the music and schedule.

Technology is always changing and it has significantly impacted our website. Our Web Architect, David Loofbourrow is continuing the refinement of our completely redesigned website. We are working on new features including Regional Web Pages within the site. The most exciting new enhancement is the development of "Lift Your Voice" Rotary Musical Database which will be available to members. It will be introduced at the Conventions, actual and virtual. I believe you will find it an incredible resource for music appropriate to Rotary Meetings and gatherings, with the ability to drill down by country of origin, style, where to find the music and even video resources, if they are available. This has been a massive under-taking led by Susan DuPree, a past Global Chair of IFRM and her committee and our web architect. It is designed to grow, but we will need your help in finding music and the requisite permissions.

Membership

Our membership numbers are increasing, many are joining in India due to the continuing work of **Paddy Iyer** (**Regional Vice Chair India and Sri Lanka**. Currently, IFRM has more than 1200 members in 43 countries of more than 90 are Lifetime Members. We have over 1,500 on the database, but not all of their dues are current so they are not counted as "active" IFRM members. The programmatic addition of IFRM Sings through Zoom has also helped increase our membership as well as our partnership with Music Mends Minds.

Our database is now being maintained by our Membership Chair, **Barry Oxford**. Barry, David and I are working to make the database available to all members.

We continue to try to address some persistent issues:

- Updating the membership database: All our communication is by e-mail, and we get many "bounces" from sent mail because members do not update their membership information. We encourage all members to go to the website (www.IFRM.org) and update their e-mail address and other information on their profile. Your changes will automatically update on the IFRM database.
- Renewal of dues: Members pay \$35 USD dues for a three-year membership. Dues always expire on June 30—the end of the Rotary year. Please check your profile on the website. After you log in, you can renew online through the membership link on the website. Starting in April of the year membership expires, member receive a reminder notification when they visit the website.
- Communication with IFRM Membership: As Chair, I publish a bi-monthly e-bulletin, Staccato, as well as a periodic newsletter, Music Notes. We are seeing a slight increase in those who open Stacatto, but it remains less than 40% of our members, who actually open Stacatto. We continue to use Staccato as our best communication tool. All issues of Music Notes are published on our website and can be accessed by going to www.IFRM.org, go to 'newsletters' on the menu bar, and click on the top entry for the latest issue. (You do not need to sign into the website.) IFRM also has a very active mail list on googlegroups and is another benefit of IFRM membership. If you are not already signed up, you can do so by

Keeping the Beat...with IFRM Board Member Curtis Reinhardt by Ada Kahn (RC of Evanston, IL)





Curtis Reinhardt has been on the IFRM Board of Directors since 2001. He joined Rotary in 1988. He is a charter member of Passport Club of the Central Coast (San Luis Obispo County, CA) D5240 and just completed his Presidential year, 2021-22.

Prior to the Passport club, Curtis belonged to Rotary clubs in Santa Rosa ,CA, West RC, Steamboat Springs, CO, RC Centralia MO, and RC Arroyo Grande, CA. He served as Foundation chair for several clubs

He has helped with various public relations and international service projects over the years. He has been on many committees in the District and led Districtwide events. He helped produce a District 5240 Foundation Gala which featured an appearance of then RI President Ray Klinginsmith and his wife, Judy.

"Our club has 33 members and membership has remained flat during Covid," says Curtis. "The Passport concept is still trying to find its legs. It's lower costs and fewer

attendance requirements are attractive, particularly to aging, long-time Rotarian. However, having members from such a large area creates attendance problems. Our next year will be important for the club's development since we will again be able to meet freely and more often."

"My club has an increasing interest in International involvements. I'd like to connect the club in an international project with IFRM," says Curtis.

He was active with the Ambassadorial Scholarship and Group Study Exchange programs when they existed. He has also been an officer of the International Fellowship of Railroading Rotarians (IFFR).

Curtis was born in St. Louis, MO and grew up in Centralia, MO. He attended college at the University of Kansas. He now resides in Grover Beach, CA. His working career included programming, marketing and management at Night clubs and performing arts Centers. Now he is active volunteering with various music, athletic and Rotary organizations.

Curtis' dad, Bill Reinhardt, was a Rotarian for over 50 years. "From him I picked up his ability to be a doer and not merely a follower," he says.

Curtis just turned 70 but says he doesn't look and feel that old. He enjoys exercising with friends, following college football and basketball and attending all types of life music events.

His favorite places to visit include Yosemite and Grand Canyon National Parks, Tence, France, Merida ,Mexico, Kigali, Rwanda, Santa Marta, Colombia, Vienna, Austria and Barcelona, Spain.

How has Rotary evolved since you joined? "I think Rotary is becoming too politically correct and overly bureaucratic. It's too much like the United Nations! There is too much focus on international efforts. I'm all for working on worldwide health projects. But our country and world face substantial societal and political problems which I think Rotary should address. Personally, I want to focus my Rotary work toward domestic concerns."

"At conventions, I love the excitement in peoples' faces when they join in singing at the IFRM booth," says Curtis.

Curtis has attended 14 international Rotary conventions, Starting in 2001. He plans to attend the International Convention in Melbourne in 2023 and sing in the Rotary World Choir.

Whilst it has been a quiet summer due to the intense heat and drought, it is good to have something to report from this region.

I contacted a new IFRM member, Francesco Ragonese, a Rotarian from Messina in Sicily, when alerted to a new arrival on my patch by our IFRM Membership Secretary. It was unexpected, but great, to hear back from him, especially since he had a project supporting youth making music which he wanted to use our logo on ..for publicity and for which permission was happily given.

Neither of speak the other's language, but it is amazing how much can be achieved by using computer translation and I paraphrase the story from his emails :

In the last three years, with other partners, we have donated € 500 to the best student of our music conservatory, to recognise and support their start in the profession. The name of the award is "The Tree of Music". Award winners are invited every year to a pro RF concert.

To promote the fellowship, we would like to present the award in the name of IFRM

for the academic year 2021-2022. I'm not asking you for money since we already have the necessary funds, but just to write the name of IRFM on the poster.

I spoke with the president of our historic theatre in the city of Messina. He greatly appreciated my initiative and he offered to host the public event with the concert by the winner of the Tree of Music Award. He offered me a September evening and it seemed appropriate to accept.

After listening to everyone's performance, in which pieces of classical and contemporary music played, the standard was very high and we had a very difficult choice to make.

We hope to continue the association with IFRM in following years, and also next year extend the competition to all over Sicily not just Messina.
